

Reading-Berks Junior Soccer League

Secondary Player Status

(Travel League Only)

- 1) Each league has the autonomy to permit or not permit the use of secondary players within that league.
- 2) Reading Berks Jr.Soccer League Secondary Player rules :
 - a. (Status) – A player may register with more than one team during the same registration year. At initial registration the player must declare the team on which he/she will have primary status. The player will be considered a secondary player on any and all other teams with which the player registers, provided the proper paperwork is completed.
 - b. (Responsibility) – Any player registered to more than one team **MUST** participate in the game played by the team with which the player is a primary player in order to qualify him/herself as a player on the team to which he/she is registered as a secondary player if both or all teams have games scheduled on the same day.
 - c. Travel players can only play travel and cannot register on a Recreational team.
- 3) A player is a primary player on only one team and may be a secondary player with several different teams.
- 4) Secondary players on a roster count in the total number of players on a roster.
- 5) Secondary players must complete the appropriate paperwork on the Player/Team Status Form (PS-1). In addition to the player signing the PS-1, it must also be signed by the player's parent(s).
- 6) A Secondary Player Pass is issued to the player for use only in the league in which he/she is designated as a secondary player.
- 7) There is a fee for every Secondary Player Pass issued.
- 8) Secondary players on a roster are ineligible for EPYSA Indoor Cup, USYSA/EPYSA Cup play, and tournament play.
- 9) Any secondary player wishing to accompany his/her team to a tournament must do so as a "guest" player.
- 10) A player may become secondary only if he/she is registered to a team as a primary player.
- 11) Primary status must be designated at one's initial registration.
